Dear Miss Skinner,

In reply to your letter of January 28,
I am giving my comments in this letter, sending back the
article by seamount.

My general impression of the paper is
favorable. I think the subject is important and
the approach interesting. I have only a few small questions
to put.

Page 3. Of course a hypothesis is implied when the
author speaks about proportionality of
qualities. I wonder whether this is really
a necessary condition. Why not simply speaking
about ordinal qualities ?

Page 9, quite
line 5. I do not/understand what sort of set M intends
to be.

Page 10. Neither do I understand why wages have been
transformed.

If these three remarks will be
answered in the paper, it might contribute to its under-
standability.

In my country an extensive literature
and numerical material on the subject dealt with exists;
I do not know what the situation in the USA is, but I take
it that there must also be a vast material ("job evaluation").
I leave it to an American expert to judge whether not some
references to this literature should be made.
